During the month the paper based daily campus security incident logs were replaced with an electronic format. This change, while small, embraces the University's principles of sustainability.

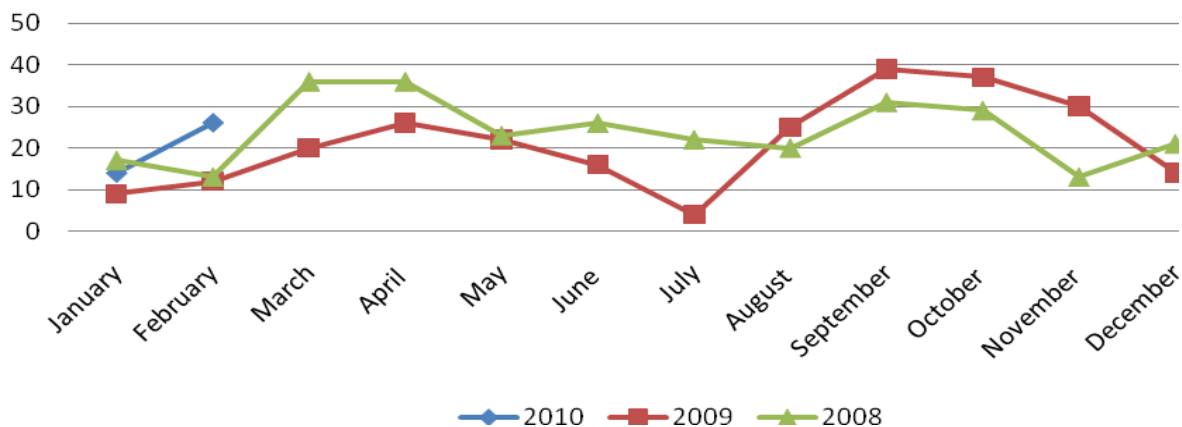
A large number of personal safety presentations were delivered during Orientation week, with a particular focus on International College students at Kelvin Grove.

Comparison of Monthly Offence Trends



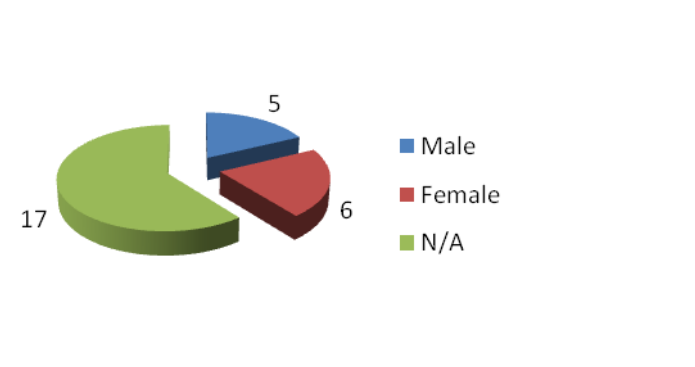

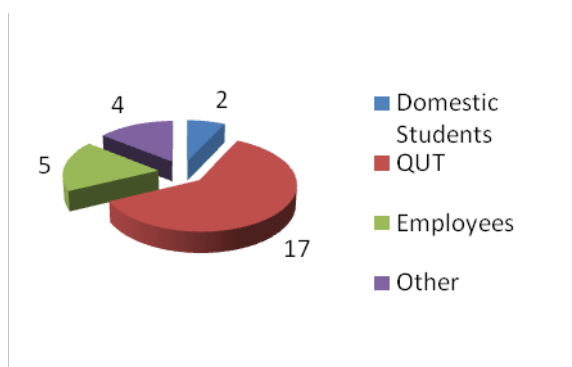
