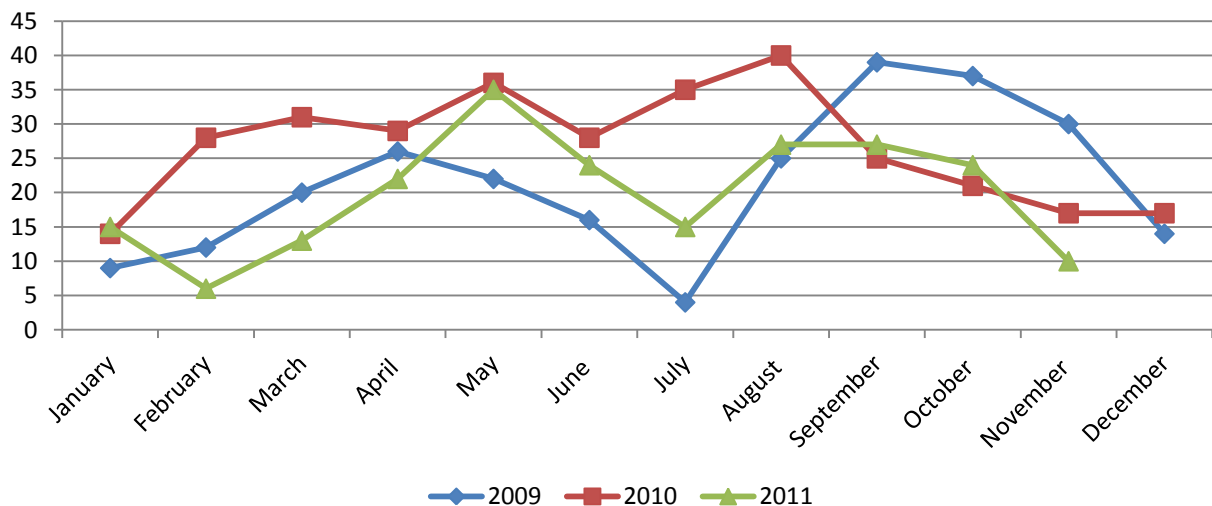
Achievements and Issues

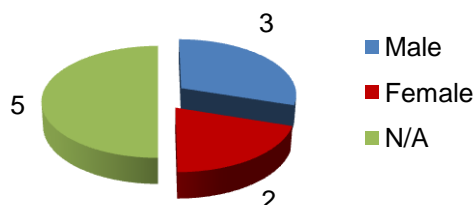

Significant Events

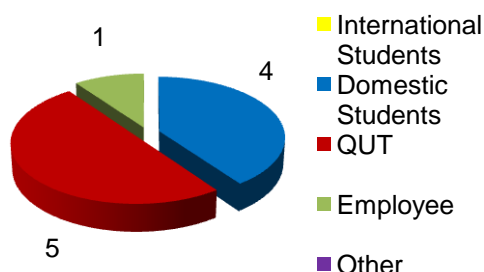
1. A male using a mobile phone to take photos under the skirts of female students whilst using a stairway at Gardens Points was reported however, the offender had decamped prior to the arrival of Security. The matter was also reported to the police.
2. A student felt threatened when the profile picture of her Facebook account was replaced with a pornographic image after having left her account open and the computer unattended at Gardens Point.
3. A patrolling security officer heard an explosion and saw a blinding flash rise from an electric pit in front of L Block Gardens Point. On investigation he found that the pit cover had dislodged, was scorched and had a hole burnt through it. The area was barricaded off and reported to maintenance staff.
4. A minor break in was reported at the old student accommodation at Kelvin Grove. Police were also advised.
5. Lockers at J Block, Kelvin Grove were damaged by two Kelvin Grove State High School Students who were identified and detained with the assistance of a school teacher and the matter was reported to the police.

6. The police advised that a group of “Occupy Brisbane” protestors that had been removed successively from Post Office Square and Queens Park had relocated to the City Botanic Gardens. A concern was held that they may attempt to occupy the University Campus as they did at RMIT and the Registrar was advised. The protestors were monitored and left shortly after for King George Square.
7. 5 Vagrants, 63 rollerbladers/skateboarders, 25 bicycle riders and 3 trespassers were escorted from campus.
